


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
## **Hand Hygiene Compliance**

Improving hand hygiene, through the appropriate use of alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water, is the single most effective way of reducing the spread of infections.

The Credit Valley Hospital implemented the *Just Clean Your Hands* campaign in April 2008, which is a multi-faceted hand hygiene program. The campaign includes education for health care providers, patients and visitors, as well as an audit process to evaluate the hand hygiene practices of health care providers. Hand hygiene involves everyone in the hospital, including patients. Patients and their visitors should also practice good hand hygiene before and after entering the patient's room.
