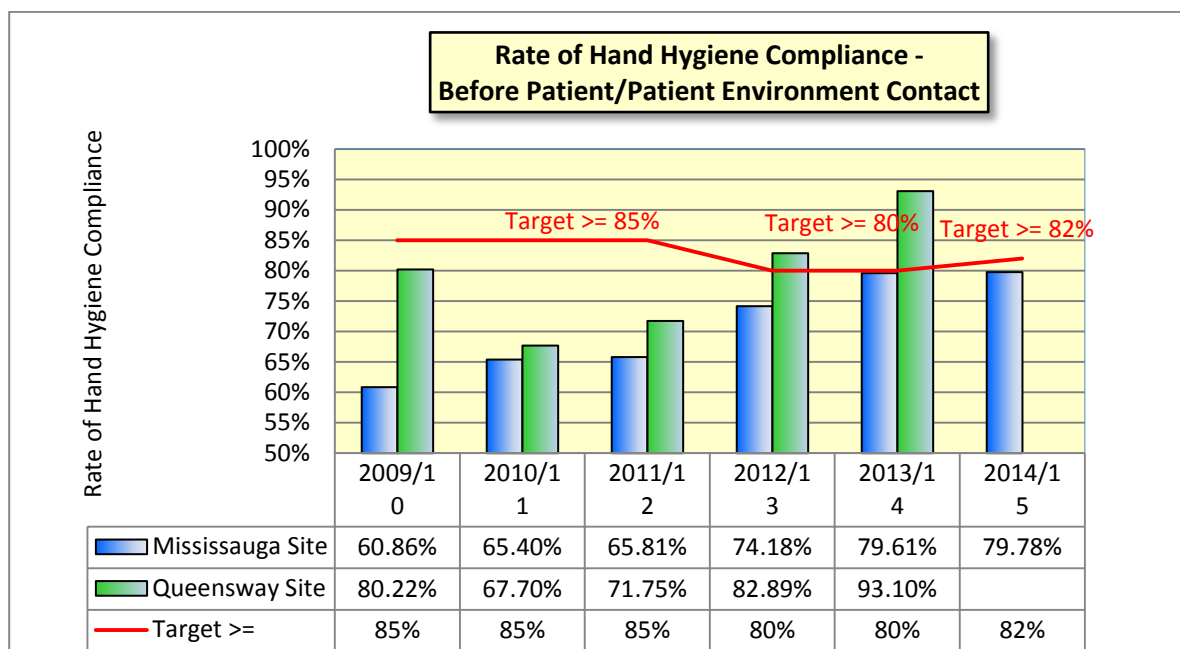
Hand Hygiene Publicly Reported Annually

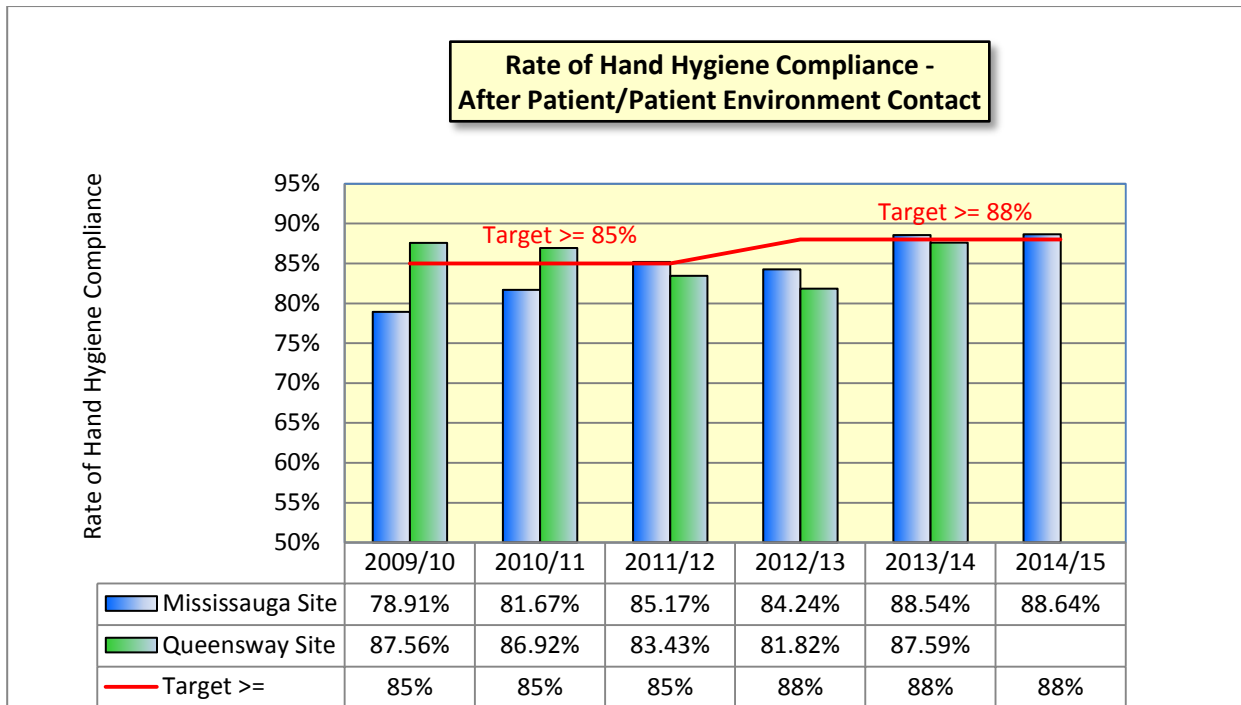
What you should know about Hand Hygiene:

Patient safety is a top priority at Trillium Health Partners. Trillium's goal is to reduce the number of hospital acquired infections. Hand hygiene is considered the single most important way to reduce hospital acquired infections. Trillium has a number of practices in place to help prevent and control infections, including a comprehensive hand hygiene program. Trillium also participates in the Ontario Hospital Association's Clean Hands Protect Lives initiative. The results of Trillium's hand hygiene observational audit report are presented below:
