

TRILLIUM HEALTH PARTNERS CELEBRATES AMAZING YEAR IN RACE TO TRANSFORM HEALTH CARE

(Mississauga, ON), June 6, 2016 – Trillium Health Partners (THP) has crossed the finish line at the end of another great year, having made significant progress in advancing a new kind of health care.

THP celebrated its accomplishments with Olympic gold medalist and TV host, Jon Montgomery, who spent the day meeting with frontline staff and delivered the keynote address at the hospital's Annual Community Address June 2, 2016.

Over the last year, the hospital set records with over 1.6 million patient visits, more than ever before; THP conducted more surgeries (63,233), delivered more babies (8,712) and cared for more patients in its Emergency Departments (ED) and Urgent Care Centre (273,613) than any other hospital in Ontario. Other achievements include:

- Received \$5 million from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care to plan for our projected need of 955 new beds over the next 20 years.
- Broke ground on Phase 3 Redevelopment of Credit Valley Hospital.
- Reduced in-hospital admissions and ED visits for patients with chronic diabetes by 55%.
- Provided renal patients with more convenient and flexible treatment options.
- Established a partnership with St. Elizabeth Home Care to support smoother, more coordinated transitions from hospital to home for cardiac surgery patients.
- Launched new Rapid Evaluation and Assessment of Cancer Treatment (REACT) clinic for cancer patients to access timely symptom and side effect support without visiting the ED.
- Raised \$32.1 million through donations, more than ever before.
- Ended the fiscal year on firm financial footing with a balanced budget despite rising demand for services.

These successes were not accomplished in the face of substantial hurdles. THP continues to experience unprecedented demand for services, caring for more patients than ever before within the same resources. Over the next 20 years, no hospital in Ontario will require more services or beds than THP, making it more urgent than ever to find innovative solutions, build partnerships and work with government partners to address the hospital's increasing capacity pressures.

"We are putting innovative ideas into action as we strive to transform health care and address our community's needs," said Michelle DiEmanuele, President and CEO, THP. "We must continue to believe in our vision and find the courage to be disciplined and relentless on our journey to create a new kind of health care."

"Trillium Health Partners is a leader of change, and the hospital's accomplishments over the past fiscal year exemplify our commitment to continuous transformation across the health care system," said Edward Sellers, outgoing Chair, THP Board of Directors. "Our community members can take pride in the work their hospital – one of the highest performing in Canada – is doing to provide patients with greater access to high quality care that will be sustainable for generations to come."

THP also received tremendous support from the community to support the hospital's goals through more than 47,000 donations and more than 110 fundraising events.

"We're overjoyed and deeply grateful to our community once again for another outstanding year," said Steve Hoscheit, President and CEO, Trillium Health. "Each year, our community continues to raise the bar and exemplifies the true spirit of what giving back is all about. We couldn't be more thankful."
