EQUITY AND INCLUSIVITY IN HEALTH CARE TAKES CENTRE STAGE AT PRESTIGIOUS ANNUAL LECTURE

Trillium Health Partners holds third Hazel McCallion Annual Lecture in Shaping Healthier Communities

November 29, 2022 (Mississauga, ON) – Trillium Health Partners' (THP) Institute for Better Health (IBH), in partnership with University of Toronto's Dalla Lana School of Public Health, held its third *Hazel McCallion Annual Lecture in Shaping Healthier Communities*. The lecture aims to engage the community about critical issues, challenges, and cutting-edge developments in research and innovation in health care. This event brings locally, nationally and internationally-acclaimed scientists, innovators, and community builders to inspire thinking and action to advance population health to shape a healthier tomorrow. With a focus on improving access, quality and the experience of care for all, this year's lecture was named *Health Equity in the Learning Health System: Insights from the Pandemic to Inform Better Health.*

Keynote presentations were delivered by two renowned thought leaders in health equity, providing international and local perspectives. Dr. Lisa Cooper, James F. Fries Professor of Medicine and Bloomberg Distinguished Professor of Equity in Health and Health Care, Johns Hopkins University Schools of Medicine, Nursing, and Bloomberg School of Public Health spoke about health equity at the bedside, while Dr. Kathy Hogarth, Dean and Professor in the Faculty of Social Work, Wilfred Laurier University spoke about the importance of community engagement in improving equity and building an inclusive system of care.

An interactive panel discussion was held following the presentation, and included dialogue on what needs to be done to dismantle barriers and make health care services and delivery more equitable. Dr. Audrey Laporte, Professor and Director, Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation, Dalla Lana School of Public Health, University of Toronto, spoke about the University of Toronto's partnership with IBH and the collective work that is underway to build research capacity in key areas that align with the hospital and community's needs. The event was brought to a close by Hazel McCallion, former Mayor of Mississauga, THP's Honorary Guardian and namesake of the Lecture.

As a community-based institute, IBH has a key role in understanding the needs, preferences and priorities of our community through research and innovation to create a healthier and more equitable tomorrow. Launched in 2018, the *Hazel McCallion Annual Lecture in Shaping Healthier Communities* was created to provide a platform to engage with our community and inspire thinking and action to advance approaches that improve the quality and experience of care from all perspectives.
