Institute for Better Health Researcher Awarded Prestigious CIHR Mid-Career Prize in Research and Aging

MISSISSAUGA, **ON (March 7**, **2023)** – Trillium Health Partners' (THP) Institute for Better Health (IBH) is pleased to announce that Dr. Lisa McCarthy, Clinician Scientist at IBH has been awarded the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Mid-Career Prize in Research and Aging.

This Prize is awarded annually to the top two mid-career investigators with the highest ranking projects in the Fall Project Grant competition that are relevant to one of the Institute of Aging's Strategic Directions. The total amount of the prize is \$50,000.



Dr. McCarthy also received \$677,024 from the CIHR Fall 2022 Project Grant award for her project, "Deintensifying diabetes management for older adults living in long term care: A multimethod study".

The project focuses on how the wellbeing of long-term care (LTC) residents with diabetes can be improved by implementing an intervention that reduces the intensity of diabetes management.

In Ontario, more than half of LTC residents with diabetes are treated too strictly, putting them at risk for harms like low blood sugar and its consequences. Given this, there is a need to

deintensify the care of LTC residents with diabetes by stopping or reducing diabetes medications and decreasing how often blood sugar is monitored, etc.

"I am proud to receive not only the CIHR Fall Project Grant, but also the Mid-Career Prize in Research and Aging," says Dr. McCarthy. "The work our team is doing to reduce the harm associated with unnecessary diabetes medications and monitoring, will hopefully improve the health and safety of LTC residents with diabetes in our community and beyond."
