Careteam Technologies and THP are collaborating with the Mississauga Health Ontario Health Team, with a first deployment of the combined platform focused on enabling truly collaborative team-based care coordination of palliative care. Meeting the key priorities raised through co-design, the platform will empower patients, caregivers and families to have the ability to identify who is on their team and invite them to the platform. Frontline providers will be connected to enable the seamless sharing of key information across partners and sectors to facilitate smooth transitions of care. The platform can be scaled to any clinical area across community and acute settings.

"The potential of combining both of these patient-centred platforms is undeniable and will create a gold standard solution for more integrated care planning and coordination," said Simone Harrington, VP, Institute for Better Health.
